cross our school system, we focus on ensuring high quality instruction for all our students by purposefully supporting teachers to advance their learning. We're committed to offering meaningful professional development for all our staff and leadership development in our Aspiring Administrator program. We are taking significant strides to support the team teaching model at the middle school level by adding more teachers and reducing class sizes. We are also continuing to lower class size at the elementary level with strong focus on primary grades. This year, key initiatives include the recent adoption of a new math curriculum, as well as committee recommendations for our world language and visual and performing arts programs.

Great Teaching with Strong Support

- Continue implementation of a standards-based reporting system at elementary and middle schools. Staff are focusing on progress reports to families to provide clear, direct, routine feedback to parents and students on progress toward standards in key content areas.
- Open the Bellingham Multilingual Academy to support secondary English language learner students who have little or no formal education.
- Continue the district's preK-8 literacy adoption. To support balanced literacy in our elementary schools, we are focusing on implementing the writing portion of the literacy curriculum.

- Continue to support staff in teaching diverse learners, including highly capable learners and implementing committee recommendations.
- Support outstanding leadership in every school and develop future leaders through the Aspiring Administrators Program, deans, assistant principals and teacher

OTHER IMPORTANT PRIORITIES

- Continue our work as a state leader in early learning by supporting kindergarten and physical education teachers instruction with WaKIDS data collection, providing professional development for specialists and administrators.
- Develop effective support models for students entering kindergarten to meet higher standards. For example, smaller class sizes and more adults in classrooms at the beginning of the school year.
- Offer parent education opportunities through partnerships with WELA, Whatcom Community College and Bellingham Technical College.

- Take next steps to ensure an excellent education for all students without charging families. Staff are working to fund all costs of education with a focus on reducing school supply fees and other costs for students and families.

- Continue implementation of Playworks at elementary schools to develop health and positive social skills.
- Build and adopt a sustainable budget in support of our Priorities for Progress.
- Build fair and equitable compensation models for all staff.
- Build a comprehensive preK-12 counseling program.
- Develop a system of equity and opportunity for all with beforeand after-school activities and athletics.

- Build partnerships, financial support and grant funding through the Bellingham Public Schools Foundation to help all students.
- Partner with Western Washington University's Woodring College of Education, Vista, Washington Reading Corps, Community in Schools and Futures Northwest, to use grant funding for AmeriCorps college access coordinators.

ur collective commitment is that each child will be exceptional in his or her own way, with an array of educational and vocational options to support a diversity of life choices. A child's post-secondary pathway may involve study at a four-year university, a two-year community college, a technical certification, or a start-up venture, among a myriad of others. To prepare our students for post-secondary options, we have implemented a technology replacement schedule to ensure students and staff have access to effective learning tools. We continue to support and integrate effective programs, such as International Baccalaureate (IB) and Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID).

- Continue to pursue an improved schedule and expanded school day that will allow middle and high school students to take more courses and electives.
- Plan for one-to-one student access to technology program and engage our community in planning for a renewed technology levy to go to

- Increase opportunities for middle and high school students to earn course credit based on competency rather than seat time, such as world language credits for English Language Learners.
- Improve Career and Technical Education (CTE) options and coordination for students, and expand partnership with Northwest Career and Technical Academy.
- Continue innovative practices for resource conservation by working with students, staff and utility providers to reduce our use of electricity, natural gas, water and other resources.
- Enhance custodial and utility/ grounds support to schools especially related to heating and ventilation controls to reduce energy use and increase savings.
- Expand Bellingham Virtual Learning (BVL) for online learning and continue partnerships with the Graduation Alliance and Bellingham Technical College engagement programs.
