Superintendent's Updates, Questions and Answers

[Start and end times](#): Dr. Baker reminded the group that our district implemented a change in fall 2017 to push back the start time for high school based on medical research. Because of transportation complexities, that change meant starting elementary earlier. Other districts across the state and country, including the California legislature, are all looking at mandating districts start high school later.

Bellingham Public Schools and Dr. Baker recently [received recognition](#) for offering drivers education. There are 295 districts in our state and Bellingham is the only district that offers free drivers ed in high school, which saves families over \$400.

[Levies 2020](#): The state funds what it calls a “prototypical model” for K-12 public education. We do not believe their model meets our standards for what is best for students and our community. An example of where our local community’s standards are higher than the state’s model is nursing. The state funds 1.6 nurses for 12,000 students across 22 schools. We fund an additional seven nurses to serve our students. There are many other examples of deficiencies in the state funding model.
